# What is a Tablet?

- Combination of a computer and notebook
  - Has features of both
  - Weighs approximately 3 lbs.
  - Can use all Windows based products
  - Have the option of using a writing pad, a keyboard, or voice recognition

# What is the Tablet Used for?

- Taking notes in classrooms
  - Math, Economics, Psychology, Human Services, Sociology
  - VIP students can get notes from email and Jaws program can read their notes (or turn the notes into Braille).
  - Drawing graphs, charts, pictures, formulas, etc...

# Different Tablet Programs

---

- Windows Journal
  - Used for drawing graphs, pictures, equations, formulas, etc...
    - Use in Math and Economics class
    - See example
    - Can email students their notes after class.

# Tablet Programs cont...

---

- Input Panel Tool
  - Use with a Windows-based program (Word, notepad, excel, etc...)
  - Can also use in place of typing on keyboard.
  - Use for writing emails, file names

# One Note Program

---

- Microsoft Office notetaking program
- Can organize notes like a notebook
- Can use handwriting or typed text
- Can audio record notes
- Can easily search for notes
- Add notes from the web (copy and paste)
- Draw charts, graphs, pictures, etc...



# Benefits of Using the Tablet PC for Notetaking

---

- Better Organized
  - Save notes in folders using USB stick/disc, etc...
  - Easy to add notes/insert more space
- Saves Time
  - Ex: Add notes to Power Point slides

# Benefits cont...

---

- Get notes quickly and effectively
  - Email notes to students!
  - Do not have to make copies
- Save money over time
  - Ex: RIT reports
